- 1 tub (8 oz.) COOL WHIP whipped topping, thawed, divided
- 1 ready-to-use graham cracker crumb crust
- 1 can (15 oz.) pumpkin
- 2 pkg. (3.4 oz) JELL-O instant vanilla pudding
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. ground ginger
- 1/4 tsp. ground cloves
