They have to constantly look for a compromise between a low production cost and a short time to market. Right now it takes about 30 days by sea from Asia. Speeding delivery to market is an increasing necessity and consumers are also concerned about low wage and high environmental cost of offshore production. Besides that, the Asian clothing market is growing and the companies in China, Vietnam, and Bangladesh will want to deliver products to market in their own neighborhoods, creating a shortage of clothing destined to Western buyers.

With cheaper freight and lower duties, it becomes less expensive to produce a pair of jeans in Mexico than in China for our U.S. market. Automation can drive down the cost in Western countries. Did you know it takes an average of 19 minutes to sew a pair of jeans? McKinsey thinks robotics can cut that time by 40% to 90%; distressing the jeans can go from 20 minutes to 90 seconds. Right now it's too early to see tags in your clothes saying "Made in the U.S.A." But instead look for "Hacho en Mexico" or "Hacho en \_\_\_\_\_", naming a Central American country.

("Hacho en" is Spanish for "Made in")
